Introduction

During the year under review interest in use of proceedings under the auspices of the Centre continued to grow. The Centre noted among other things the conclusion of additional bilateral agreements between capital exporting and capital importing States providing for recourse to the Centre for disputes that might arise between one of these States and nationals of the other.

Further to a suggestion of the Secretary-General at the Tenth Annual Meeting, the Secretariat prepared a tentative proposal for the administration by the Centre, at the request of interested parties, of certain types roceedings which are not within its al jurisdiction as defined in Article 25 of the Convention. The draft was circulated to the members of the Administrative Council for comments which were being received

by the end of the fiscal year.

The proceedings envisaged by the Secretariat draft are conciliation and arbitration proceedings which do not meet all the requirements of the Convention, for instance those relating to nationality, and proceedings limited to pure fact finding. Such proceedings would not be governed by the Convention, even if administered by the Centre, but could nevertheless perform a useful service. It is believed that proceedings between governments and foreign nongovernmental entities would be facilitated by the existence of institutional arrangements in the form of rules and an administering authority. Also, the Centre, created under a Convention whose broad aim is to foster international cooperation for economic development, is the only institution dealing exclusively with proceedings betwon such parties. Finally, the creation of entre under the auspices of the World

Bank has given it both moral authority and

a clear mandate of strict impartiality which it has scrupulously striven to carry out.

A proposal taking into account governmental comments will be submitted to the Administrative Council for discussion at its Eleventh Annual Meeting.

Signatures and Ratifications

As of July 1, 1977, seventy-three States had signed the Convention, Fiji being the most recent signatory. Sixty-seven States had taken the final step toward becoming Contracting States by depositing instruments of ratification. A tabulation of the Contracting States and other signatories of the Convention appears in Annex 1.1

Designations of Panel Members and Other Actions Taken by Contracting States **Pursuant to the Convention**

The members of the Panel of Conciliators and of the Panel of Arbitrators are designated by the Contracting States and by the Chairman of the Administrative Council. Pursuant to Article 13(1) of the Convention Contracting States may designate to each Panel four persons who may, but need not, be its nationals. Pursuant to Article 13(2) the Chairman may designate ten persons to each Panel. The persons so designated to a Panel by the Chairman shall each have a different nationality. The Panel of Conciliators now contains 146 names, and the Panel of Arbitrators 146 names.²

Pursuant to Article 54(2) of the Convention each Contracting State is required to notify the Secretary-General of the designation of the competent court or other authority to which requests for the recognition and enforcement of arbitral awards are to be furnished. The requirements concerning the

enforceability of arbitral awards rendered pursuant to the Convention are among the key provisions of that instrument, and, therefore, States which have not yet done so are urged to notify the Centre of such designations as soon as possible. Fifty-one states have as of this date made such designations.3

Advance Acceptance of the Jurisdiction of the Centre

An increasing number of bilateral treaties for the protection and promotion of foreign investments, and also investment laws of host countries, provide for the acceptance of the jurisdiction of the Centre as a means of settling disputes. A list of such treaties and laws is set forth in Annex 4.4

To assist member governments and investors in setting up provisions for consent to conciliation and arbitration in such a way as to fulfill all necessary jurisdictional requirements of the Convention, the Centre has prepared a set of model clauses for use in international investment agreements.5 At the suggestion of one of the Contracting States, an additional model clause is being drafted which could be used by parties to an investment agreement wishing to have complex technical questions resolved by an expedited arbitral procedure.

Tenth Annual Meeting of the Administration Council

The Tenth Annual Meeting of the Administrative Council was held in Manila, Philippines, on October 7, 1976, in conjunction with the Annual Meeting of the Board of Governors of the World Bank. At this meeting the Council approved the Tenth Annual Report on the operation of the Centre and the budget for Fiscal Year 1977. The relevant resolutions are reproduced in Annex 5.

Disputes Submitted to the Centre

The past year saw the termination of two arbitration proceedings between bauxite companies and the Government of Jamaica (the Alcoa and Kaiser cases), and the registration of a new case, the first one brought by a Government against a private party; the Government of Gabon instituted arbitration proceedings against Société SERETE, a French corporation.

The summary information provided below regarding procedural developments in the six arbitration cases which were submitted to the Centre is supplemented by Annex 6 which contains detailed data relating to past years as well as the present fiscal year.

(1) Holiday Inns/Occidental Petroleum vs. Government of Morocco

In September 1976 the arbitrator appointed by the Claimants resigned and a successor was appointed in October. Before the proceedings could make any progress they were once again suspended in December 1976 upon the unexpected and deeply regretted death of the Tribunal's President Sture Petrén. His successor accepted his nomination in April 1977 and the reconstituted Tribunal is expected to take up the proceedings shortly after the close of fiscal year.

(2) Adriano Gardella SpA vs. Government of Ivory Coast

The Tribunal met several times during the fiscal year to hear witnesses and oral argument on the question of liability, and for deliberations. A decision is expected to be rendered in September 1977.

(3) Alcoa Minerals of Jamaica, Inc. vs. **Government of Jamaica**

On February 27, 1977, the Arbitral Tribunal issued a Procedural Order, pursuant to Arbitration Rule 43(1), noting the discontinuance of the proceeding at the joint request of the parties.

(4) Kaiser Bauxite Company vs. Government of Jamaica

On February 27, 1977, the Arbitral Tribunal issued a Procedural Order, pursuant to Arbitration Rule 44, noting the disa tinuance of the proceeding at the requi the Claimant.

(5) Reynolds Jamaica Mines, Ltd. and Reynolds Metals Company vs. Government of Jamaica

On February 11, 1977, the memorial on the merits from Reynolds was received by the Centre. On February 27, 1977, the Arbitral Tribunal issued a Procedural Order setting September 8, 1977, as the time-limit for filing of a counter-memorial by the Government of Jamaica.

(6) Government of Gabon vs. Société SERETE S.A.

On June 7, 1976, the Centre received a request for arbitration from the Government of Gabon. The case was registered on October 5, 1976, and the Arbitral Tribunal was constituted on February 28, 1977. Neither party has taken any step in the proceedings. The Centre has been informed that the parties have reached an agreement, but has not yet received a request for distinuance of the proceedings.

Finance

The Financial Statement of the Centre for Fiscal Year 1977 is set forth in Annex 7. The expenditures of the Centre were again covered entirely by the value of the services and facilities made available by the Bank free of charge pursuant to the Memorandum of Administrative Arrangements concluded between the Bank and the Centre in February 1967,4 and by income from the sale of publications. Thus it was not necessary to assess any excess expenditures to the Contracting States pursuant to Article 17 of the Convention.

The Centre's expenses which are attributable to the pending arbitration proceedings are borne by the parties in accordance with the Centre's Administrative and Financial Regulations. In accordance with these Regulations, the Secretary-General calls on the parties from time to time to make advance deposits to defray the expenses of the proceedings.

Publications

Annex 8 sets forth an addition to the bibliography of legal studies on the Convention and the Centre presented in the previous Annual Reports. A consolidated bibliography, which includes publications containing the official texts of the Convention and unofficial translations; the Institution, Conciliation and Arbitration Rules; and books, articles and reports concerning the Convention and the Centre, is available from the Centre on request.

Annex 9 gives a list of publications prepared by the Centre and available, for the most part, free of charge.

The Centre prepared this past year two new volumes for the loose-leaf service "Investment Laws of the World-Developing Countries". The laws of 43 countries have now been published (Afghanistan, Benin, Cameroon, Central Botswana, Burundi, African Empire, Chad, Congo, Egypt, Gabon, Ghana, Greece, Guyana, Indonesia, Ivory Coast, Jamaica, Jordan, Kenya, Korea, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malaysia, Mauritania, Morocco, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Senegal, Singapore, Somalia, Sri. Lanka, Swaziland, Taiwan, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Uganda, Upper Volta, Yugoslavia, Zaire, and Zambia).

The service is being published and sold commercially by Oceana Publications, Inc. of Dobbs Ferry, New York. It deals on a country-by-country basis with internal law and international agreements affecting foreign investment, and consists of a compilation of constitutional, legislative, regulatory and treaty materials. It is periodically updated and supplemented as necessary. A brochure concerning the service is available from the publisher or the Centre on request.

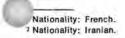

The Memorandum of Administrative Arrangements between the Centre and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (the Bank) which became effective as of October 14, 1966, provides, *inter alia*, that, except to the extent that the Centre may be reimbursed by the parties to proceedings for fees and expenses of members of Conciliation Commissions, Arbitral Tribunals or Committees of Arbitrators, the Bank shall provide the following services and facilities to the Centre without charge:

(1) The services of staff members and consultants;

(2) Other administrative services and facilities, such as travel, communication facilities, office accommodations, furniture, equipment, supplies and printing.

The reported expenditures on behalf of the Centre represent the value of the services provided by the Bank and include only those amounts identified by the Bank as being directly related to the Centre and, accordingly, do not include any indirect or overhead costs of the Bank.

The Bank has not made a direct cash contribution to the Centre. The reported contribution of \$181,410 is equal to the value of services provided by the Bank on behalf of the Centre, less reimbursements by the Centre from its sale of publications and registration fees.

The Centre's expenses which are attributable to arbitration proceedings are borne by the parties in accordance with the Centre's Administrative and Financial Regulations. In accordance with these Regulations, the Secretary-General calls on the parties to make advance deposits with the Centre from time to time to defray these expenses. At June 30, 1977 there were five such arbitration procedings for which the Centre held advance deposits from the parties involved to cover expenses, including approximately \$2,400 held for two of these proceedings which were discontinued during the year and which will be refunded to the parties. In addition, there was one other proceeding for which no advance deposit had been received.

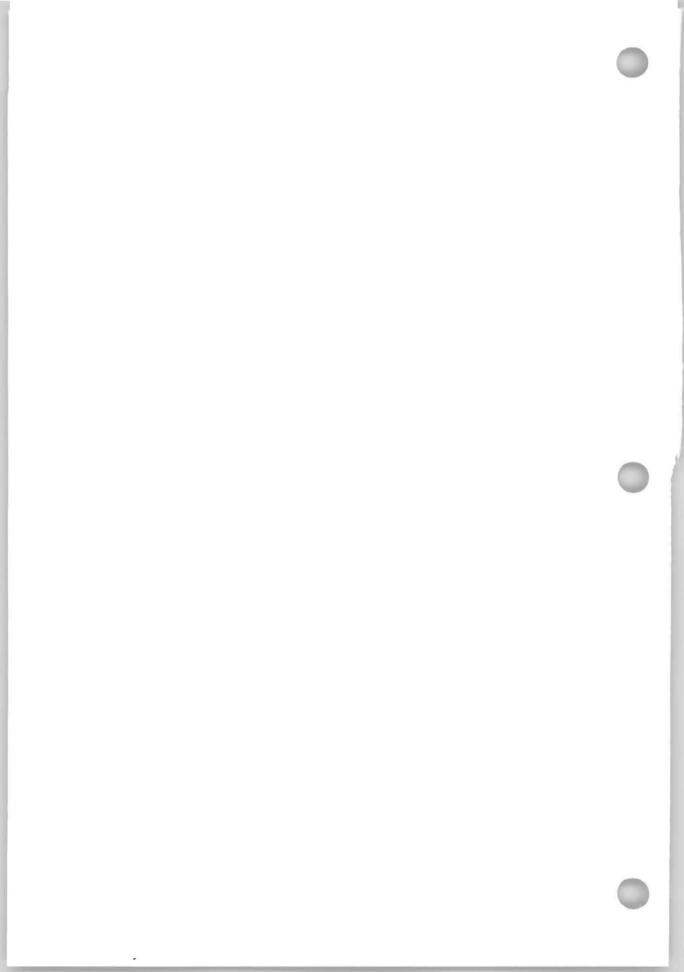

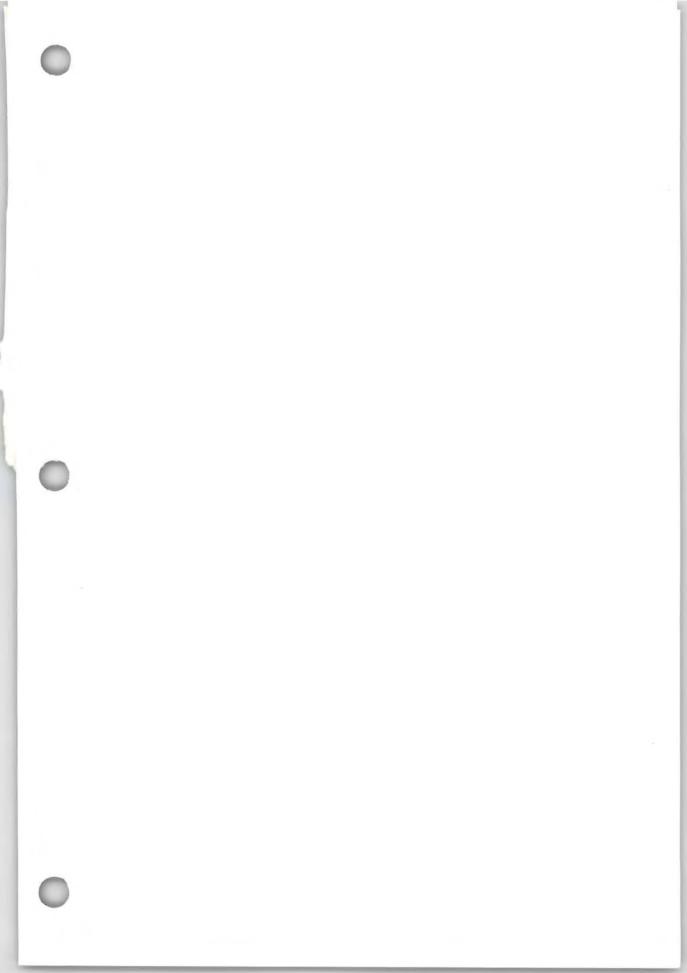
