## Highlights of the Year

During the year under review:

- the number of Contracting States increased from 71 to 75;
- the number of Signatory States increased from 77 to 80;
- the proposal for the creation of the Additional Facility was approved by the Administrative Council;
- one pending arbitration proceeding was discontinued after the parties had reached an amicable settlement, while three other proceedings were continuing; and
- an Agreement was signed between the Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee and ICSID, providing for reciprocal cooperative arrangements between ICSID and the Regional Centre for Commercial Arbitration (Kuala Lumpur).

## Signatures and Ratifications

During the year the Convention was signed by Comoros (September 26, 1978), Philippines (September 26, 1978) and Papua New Guinea (October 20, 1978), bringing the number of signatories to 80. Instruments of ratification were deposited by Papua New Guinea (October 20, 1978), Comoros (November 7, 1978), Philippines (November 17, 1978) and Kuwait (February 2, 1979). At June 30, 1979, there were 75 Contracting States. A list of Contracting States and other signatories of the Convention appears in Annex 1.<sup>1</sup>

## Twelfth Annual Meeting of the Administrative Council

The Twelfth Annual Meeting of the Administrative Council was held in Washington, D.C. on September 27, 1978, in conjunction with the Annual Meeting of the Board of Governors of the World Bank. At this meet-

ing the Council approved the proposal for the creation of an Additional Facility. It also approved the Twelfth Annual Report on the operation of the Centre and the budget for Fiscal Year 1979. The resolutions are reproduced in Annex 5.

## The Additional Facility

After extensive exchanges of views over the past two years and two working level sessions in Washington, D.C. last September, the proposal for the creation of an Additional Facility was approved by the Administrative Council at its Twelfth Annual Meeting.

The scope within which and the terms on which the Secretariat may administer these proceedings, which will of course not be governed by the provisions of the Convention, are set out in the Additional Facility Rules. They provide, among other things, that the Additional Facility will not be available for the settlement of ordinary commercial disputes. In this connection the Council recorded its views that economic transactions which (a) may or may not, depending on their terms, be regarded by the parties as investments for purposes of the Convention, which (b) involve long-term relationships or the commitment of substantial resources on the part of either party, and which (c) are of special importance to the economy of the State party, can be clearly distinguished from ordinary commercial transactions. Examples of such transactions may be found in various forms of industrial cooperation agreements and major civil works contracts.

The Rules governing the Additional Facility were circulated to ICSID's mailing list in the last part of 1978.<sup>2</sup> An annotated version of the Rules is now available on request from the Centre.<sup>3</sup> Articles by the Secretary-General were also prepared for publication

in the 1979 *Yearbook of the International Council for Commercial Arbitration* (in English) and in the *Revue de l'Arbitrage* (in French).

It will take some time before the Additional Facility becomes widely known and an assessment of the usefulness of the Additional Facility will have to wait. While the Centre has received many inquiries concerning possible access to the Additional Facility, only one formal request for approval of an agreement contemplating recourse to Additional Facility proceedings has been submitted to the Secretary-General pursuant to Article 4(1) of the Additional Facility Rules and approved by him. The agreement in question concerns industry-wide technical services to be provided by a company which is a national of a Contracting State to an agency of a non-Contracting State relating to an important industrial sector.

#### **Agreement with Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee**

On February 5, 1979, ICSID entered into an agreement with the Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee and the Regional Centre for Commercial Arbitration (Kuala Lumpur) established by the Committee, providing for reciprocal assistance in connection with proceedings conducted under the auspices of ICSID and the Kuala Lumpur Centre respectively. The Agreement was signed for ICSID by the Secretary-General, for the AALCC by its Secretary-General, Mr. B. Sen, and for the Kuala Lumpur Centre by its Director, Mr. Zakaria Bin Yatin. The Agreement was submitted to the Administrative Council for a vote by mail and approved by the Council on April 11, 1979. The text of the Agreement is similar in substance to that of the general arrangements between the Permanent Court of Arbitration and ICSID concluded in 1968<sup>4</sup> and is reproduced in Annex 6. As a result of the conclusion of the Agreement with the AALCC, parties may now agree, pursuant to Article 63 of the Convention, on the Kuala Lumpur Centre as the seat

of ICSID conciliation and arbitration proceedings.

For a number of years the Committee, which was originally constituted in 1956 and has 38 members and a similar number of countries with observer status, has interested itself in commercial arbitration.

The Committee has called a conference in Kuala Lumpur of government officials, representatives of Chambers of Commerce and Arbitration Institutions from July 4 to 8, 1979, to discuss matters concerning settlement of disputes arising out of international transactions in the field of trade and commerce including investment disputes and other related matters. ICSID has been invited and will be represented at the conference.

#### **The Panels<sup>5</sup>**

Pursuant to Article 13(1) of the Convention, Contracting States may designate up to four persons each to the Panel of Conciliators and the Panel of Arbitrators. Litigants may, but are not required to, appoint conciliators and arbitrators from the Panels. The Chairman of the Administrative Council, when called upon to appoint conciliators and arbitrators, is restricted in his choice to the persons designated to the Panels. As of June 30, 1979, forty-three States had made such designations.

In the Twelfth Annual Report attention was drawn to the importance of the Panels.<sup>6</sup> It is hoped that Contracting States will bear this in mind and that those Contracting States that have not yet done so will make the necessary designations in order to give parties and the Chairman a wide choice of duly qualified conciliators and arbitrators when making appointments from the Panels.

#### **Advance Acceptance of the Jurisdiction of the Centre**

To assist parties to investment agreements wishing to provide for ICSID jurisdiction, the Centre has prepared a set of model

clauses which take into account all necessary jurisdictional requirements of the Convention.<sup>7</sup> It also has available a document indicating actions taken by Contracting States as to exclusion of territories, designation of constituent subdivisions or agencies to whose investment disputes the jurisdiction of the Centre extends, notifications that no approval by the State is required for the consent by a constituent subdivision or agency to the jurisdiction of the Centre, and notifications of the class or classes of disputes which the State would or would not consider submitting to the jurisdiction of the Centre.<sup>8</sup>

References to the Centre in national legislation and in bilateral treaties between capital exporting and capital importing states have been increasing steadily. Annex 4 gives an up-to-date list of all such laws and treaties.

#### **Disputes Submitted to the Centre**

During the past year, the first arbitration case submitted to the Centre was discontinued after the parties reached an amicable settlement. The three cases registered last year are still pending before the Centre. Earlier data regarding proceedings pending at June 30, 1978, and data concerning proceedings terminated before that date may be found in Annex 6 of the Eleventh Annual Report (1976-77) and pages 5 and 6 of the Twelfth Annual Report (1977-78).

#### **(1) Holiday Inns/Occidental Petroleum v. Government of Morocco** (Case ARB/72/1)

September 1978: A joint communication is received by the Centre from all parties to the proceedings informing the Arbitral Tribunal of the amicable settlement of the dispute and requesting the Tribunal to take note of the termination of the proceedings by the issuance of an order in accordance with Arbitration Rule 43(1).

October 17, 1978: The Tribunal renders a procedural order noting the discontinuance of the proceedings.

#### **(2) AGIP SpA v. Government of the People's Republic of the Congo** (Case ARB/77/1)

July 14, 1978: The Chairman of the Administrative Council appoints Messrs. Jørgen Trolle (Danish) and Fuad Rouhani (Iranian) as arbitrators and designates Mr. Trolle as President of the Tribunal.

July 18, 1978: The Tribunal is constituted and the proceedings deemed to have begun, the arbitrators having accepted their appointments as follows: Mr. R.-J. Dupuy (February 19, 1978), Mr. Jørgen Trolle (July 18, 1978) and Mr. Fuad Rouhani (July 18, 1978).

November 20 and 21, 1978: First session of the Tribunal in Paris for purposes of consulting on procedural matters as required by Arbitration Rule 20. The parties attended the sittings of the Tribunal on November 21. The Tribunal fixes January 19, 1979, and March 21, 1979, as time limits for the filing of the memorial by AGIP SpA and the counter-memorial by the People's Republic of the Congo, respectively.

November 21, 1978: Request by the Claimant that the Tribunal recommend provisional measures. The Tribunal fixes December 21, 1978, as the time limit for the Respondent to make observations on the Claimant's request.

January 18, 1978: Decision of the Tribunal, taken by correspondence, to recommend the provisional measures requested by the Claimant.

April 4 and 5, 1979: Meeting of the Tribunal in Paris, without the parties, to deliberate on the memorial and counter-memorial filed by the parties. The Tribunal invites the Claimant to file a reply not later than April 30, 1979, and the Respondent to file a rejoinder not later than May 28, 1979.

June 9, 1979: Third session of the Tribunal in Geneva, without the parties, to consider the further proceedings. Claimant filed its reply within the time limit fixed by the Tribunal. No rejoinder was filed by the Respondent. The Tribunal fixes August 30-September 1, 1979, for oral proceedings in Paris.

**(3) Société Ltd. Benvenuti & Bonfant srl v. Government of the People's Republic of the Congo (Case ARB/77/2)**

August 21, 1978: The Claimant files its memorial.

October 31, 1978: The Respondent files objections to the jurisdiction of the Tribunal.

November 17-18, 1978: Meeting of the Tribunal, without the parties, in Paris. The Tribunal determines that the proceedings on the merits are suspended pursuant to Arbitration Rule 41. The Tribunal receives Claimant's observations on Respondent's objections and fixes December 29, 1978, as the time limit for the Respondent to file its observations on the Claimant's observations, pursuant to Arbitration Rule 41(3).

January 17-19, 1979: Meeting of the Tribunal, without the parties, in Paris. The Tribunal decides that the dispute is within its competence and orders the Respondent to file a counter-memorial by March 8, 1979, the Claimant to file a reply by April 12, 1979, and the Respondent to file a rejoinder by May 22, 1979.

April 12, 1979: The Respondent not having filed the counter-memorial on March 8, 1979, the Tribunal grants the Respondent a period of grace expiring on April 30, 1979, to file a counter-memorial. The period of grace expires without the Centre having received the counter-memorial.

May 6, 1979: The Tribunal refuses a further extension of the time limit for filing the counter-memorial and convokes the parties for oral proceedings in Geneva on June 6-7, 1979.

June 6-7, 1979: Meeting of the Tribunal in Geneva, both parties being present. The Tribunal hears testimony on behalf of the Claimant and statements by counsel for the two parties. The Tribunal takes note of a memorandum agreed between the parties contemplating an amicable settlement and, at the request of the parties, decides to postpone the rendering of an award until the end of August, 1979.

**(4) Guadalupe Gas Products Corporation v. The Federal Military Government of Nigeria (Case ARB/78/1)**

March 20, 1978: Registration of the case by the Secretary-General.

May 22, 1978: Mr. Elihu Lauterpacht, Q.C. (British) accepts his appointment by the Claimant as arbitrator.

June 20, 1978: Prof. Dr. Pieter Sanders (Dutch) accepts his appointment by the Respondent as arbitrator.

March 30, 1979: No agreement having been reached between the parties regarding the appointment of a President, the Claimant, pursuant to Article 38 of the Convention, requests the Chairman of the Administrative Council to appoint the third arbitrator and to designate him as President of the Tribunal.

April 25, 1979: The Chairman, after consultations with the parties in accordance with Arbitration Rule 4(2), appoints Mr. Ivan Wallenberg (Swedish) as arbitrator and designates him as President of the Tribunal. Mr. Ivan Wallenberg having accepted his appointment, the Tribunal is constituted and the proceedings deemed to have begun.

June 19 and 20, 1979: First session of the Tribunal at the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague for the purpose of holding the consultation provided for under Arbitration Rule 20. The parties attended the sittings of the Tribunal on June 20. The Tribunal having received the claimant's memorial on June 19, it fixes October 8, 1979, as time limit for the filing of the counter-memorial by the Respondent.

**Finance**

The Financial Statement of the Centre for Fiscal Year 1979 is set forth in Annex 7. The expenditures of the Centre were again covered entirely by the value of the services and facilities made available by the World Bank free of charge pursuant to the Memorandum of Administrative Arrangements concluded between the Bank and the Centre in February 1967,<sup>9</sup> and by income from the sale of publications. Thus it was not necessary to assess any excess expenditures to the Contracting States pursuant to Article 17 of the Convention.

The Centre's expenses which are attributable to the pending arbitration proceedings are borne by the parties in accordance with the Centre's Administrative and Financial Regulations. In accordance with these Regulations, the Secretary-General calls on the parties from time to time to make advance deposits to defray the expenses of the proceedings.

### **Publications**

Annex 8 gives a list of publications prepared by the Centre and available, for the most part, free of charge.

A bibliography, which lists publications containing the official texts of the Convention and unofficial translations, the Institution, Conciliation and Arbitration Rules, and books, articles and reports concerning the Convention and the Centre, is being periodically brought up to date and is available from the Centre on request.

The Centre prepared during the past year a new volume for the loose-leaf service "Investment Laws of the World." The laws of

54 countries have now been published (Afghanistan, Benin, Botswana, Burundi, Cameroon, Central African Empire, Chad, Congo, Cyprus, Egypt, Ethiopia, Fiji, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Greece, Guinea, Guyana, Indonesia, Ivory Coast, Jamaica, Jordan, Kenya, Korea, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Malaysia, Mauritania, Mauritius, Morocco, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, Romania, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Swaziland, Taiwan, Togo, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Uganda, Upper Volta, Yugoslavia, Zaire, and Zambia).

The service is being published and sold commercially by Oceana Publications, Inc. of Dobbs Ferry, New York. It deals on a country-by-country basis with internal law and international agreements affecting foreign investment, and consists of a compilation of constitutional, legislative, regulatory and treaty materials. It is periodically updated and supplemented as necessary. A brochure concerning the service is available from the publisher or the Centre on request.

Chairman of the Administrative Council

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## Resolutions of the Administrative Council

The following resolutions were adopted by the Administrative Council at its Twelfth Annual Meeting on September 27, 1978:

### **AC(12)/RES/38 — CREATION OF AN ADDITIONAL FACILITY**

The Administrative Council

#### **RESOLVES**

1. The draft Rules authorizing the administration by the Secretariat of the Centre of certain proceedings between a State (or a constituent sub-division or agency of a State) and a national of another State which are not governed by the Convention (Additional Facility Rules) and Schedules A, B, C and D thereto, which have been submitted to this meeting, are hereby approved.
2. The Secretary-General shall annually report to the Administrative Council, in such detail as shall be consistent with the requirements of confidentiality, on the manner in which he has exercised his authority to approve access to the Additional Facility pursuant to Article 4, paragraphs (1) through (4) of the Additional Facility Rules.
3. The Administrative Council will review the operation of the Additional Facility after five years in order to decide, in the light of the experience gained during that period, whether to continue the Additional Facility or to terminate it for the future, without prejudice to approvals theretofore given under Article 4 of the Additional Facility Rules or any agreement theretofore concluded with respect of fact-finding.

### **AC(12)/RES/39 — APPROVAL OF THE ANNUAL REPORT**

#### **RESOLVES**

To approve the Twelfth Annual Report on the Operation of the Centre as set forth in the attachment to document AC/78/15.

### **AC(12)/RES/40 — ADOPTION OF BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 1979**

#### **RESOLVES**

To adopt, for the period July 1, 1978 to June 30, 1979, the budget set forth in paragraph 2 of document AC/78/6.

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The following resolution was adopted by the Administrative Council by correspondence on April 11, 1979:

### **AC(C)/RES/41 — APPROVAL OF THE AGREEMENT AMONG THE ASIAN-AFRICAN LEGAL CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE, THE REGIONAL CENTRE FOR COMMERCIAL ARBITRATION (KUALA LUMPUR) (ACTING THROUGH THE ASIAN-AFRICAN LEGAL CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE), AND THE INTERNATIONAL CENTRE FOR SETTLEMENT OF INVESTMENT DISPUTES REGARDING GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS BETWEEN THE REGIONAL CENTRE AND THE ICSID**

The Administrative Council

#### **RESOLVES**

To approve the Agreement signed on February 5, 1979.

**AGREEMENT AMONG THE ASIAN-AFRICAN LEGAL CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE, THE REGIONAL CENTRE FOR COMMERCIAL ARBITRATION (KUALA LUMPUR) (ACTING THROUGH THE ASIAN-AFRICAN LEGAL CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE), AND THE INTERNATIONAL CENTRE FOR SETTLEMENT OF INVESTMENT DISPUTES REGARDING GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS BETWEEN THE REGIONAL CENTRE AND THE ICSID**

**WHEREAS:**

Article 63(a) of the Convention on the Settlement of Investment Disputes between States and Nationals of Other States provides in pertinent part that:

“Conciliation and arbitration proceedings may be held, if the parties so agree,

- (a) at the seat of the Permanent Court of Arbitration or of any other appropriate institution, whether private or public, with which the Centre may make arrangements for that purpose; . . .”

**WHEREAS:**

In addition, the Rules of Procedure for Conciliation and for Arbitration Proceedings adopted by the Administrative Council of the International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes (hereinafter called the “ICSID”) provide for the possible examination of witnesses and experts in places other than before a Conciliation Commission or Arbitral Tribunal.

**WHEREAS:**

The Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee (hereinafter called the “Committee”) has established a Regional Centre for Commercial Arbitration at Kuala Lumpur (hereinafter called the “Regional Centre”).

**WHEREAS:**

The functions of the Regional Centre *inter alia* are to:

- (a) promote international commercial arbitration in the region;  
(b) coordinate and assist the activities of existing arbitral institutions particularly among those within the region; and  
(c) provide for arbitration under its auspices where appropriate.

**WHEREAS:**

The Committee has requested the Secretary-General of the Committee to approach governments and existing arbitral institutions for obtaining suitable facilities for the Regional Centre.

**WHEREAS:**

The ICSID, the Regional Centre (acting through the Committee) and the Committee are each desirous that the foregoing provisions be implemented by making appropriate arrangements between the ICSID and the Regional Centre (hereinafter called the “Institutions”).

**WHEREAS:**

It is understood that any arrangements concluded for this purpose between the Institutions should be reciprocal in nature and should take account of (a) the inevitable uncertainty as to the extent to which the parties to proceedings conducted under the auspices of either Institution will desire to conduct part or all of these proceedings at the seat of the other; and (b) the limited facilities available to both Institutions and to the priority that each must grant to proceedings conducted under its own auspices.

NOW THEREFORE the Parties hereto hereby agree as follows:

1. Whenever the parties to a proceeding conducted under the auspices of either Institution (the Requesting Institution) desire to conduct all or any part of the proceeding at the seat of the other Institution (the Host), the Officer of the Requesting Institution will inform the Officer of the Host, indicating to him the facilities and services expected to be required and the dates of such requirement, and specifying in particular the need for:

- (a) meeting rooms, offices and other premises;
- (b) office, simultaneous interpretation and other equipment;
- (c) services of interpreters, translators and other personnel.

A copy of the request will be furnished to the Officer of the Committee.

2. As soon as possible upon receipt of such a request the Officer of the Host will indicate the extent to which the required facilities and services can be made available on the dates indicated.

3. Thereupon, after the Officer of the Requesting Institution has consulted with the parties and with the members of the Commission or Tribunal concerned, the Officers of the Institutions will conclude specific arrangements for the particular proceeding by an exchange of letters.

4. The Requesting Institution will reimburse the Host for any expenditures incurred by the latter under such arrangements, as provided in the exchange of letters.

5. Members of the staff of the Host assigned temporarily to the Requesting Institution will during such period work exclusively under the direction of and be responsible to the Officer of the latter institution.

6. For purposes of this Agreement "Officer" means: in case of (a) the ICSID, its Secretary-General; (b) the Regional Centre, its Director; and (c) the Committee, its Secretary-General.

This Agreement may be modified or supplemented at any time by mutual agreement among the parties hereto. Each said party may, after reasonable notice, terminate the Agreement, provided that such termination shall not affect any prior specific arrangements entered into under paragraph 3 above.

This Agreement shall become effective when it shall have been approved by the Administrative Council of ICSID.

**Note**

The Memorandum of Administrative Arrangements between the Centre and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (the Bank) which became effective as of October 14, 1966, provides, *inter alia*, that, except to the extent that the Centre may be reimbursed by the parties to proceedings for fees and expenses of members of Conciliation Commissions, Arbitral Tribunals or Committees of Arbitrators, the Bank shall provide the following services and facilities to the Centre without charge:

- (1) The services of staff members and consultants;
- (2) Other administrative services and facilities, such as travel, communication facilities, office accommodations, furniture, equipment, supplies and printing.

The reported expenditures on behalf of the Centre represent the value of the services provided by the Bank and include only those amounts identified by the Bank as being directly related to the Centre and, accordingly, do not include any indirect or overhead costs of the Bank.

The Bank has not made a direct cash contribution to the Centre. The reported contribution of \$168,977 is equal to the value of services provided by the Bank on behalf of the Centre, less reimbursements by the Centre from its sale of publications and registration fees.

The Centre's expenses which are attributable to arbitration proceedings are borne by the parties in accordance with the Centre's Administrative and Financial Regulations. In accordance with these Regulations, the Secretary-General calls on the parties to make advance deposits with the Centre from time to time to defray these expenses.
